



Water Water

Overview: A thoughtful activity for one child or more, with drawing and writing.

Time: 15-20 minutes

Equipment required: Large piece of paper and felt tip pens.

Benefits:

- Helps children understand the importance of water.
- Ties in with knowledge from science and geography lessons.
- Can be a team building or solo activity.

The Activity:

1. Ask the child(ren) to think of four different places where you can find water. Examples include rivers, puddles, toilets, and bottles.
2. Provide everybody with a large piece of paper and felt tip pens.
3. As a team, create four water posters, each focusing on one of the types of water listed before.
4. If you have a group, each child can take one type. Otherwise feel free to help out, and spent a little while on each one.

Poster Prompts:

1. Draw your chosen water source in the middle of the paper.
2. Draw and write the ways in which water is used.
3. Write in bubble letters whether they think they should “save” or “waste” water, and ways they can do it.
4. Everybody can then present what they know about water to the room. What have you all learnt from each other? Did anybody hear something they hadn't thought of before?
